### **Notes:-**

Strongly designed ecclesiastical building occupying an eye-catching position midway along St Helen's Road on the corner of George Street.

Church founded 1862 and opened 12 August 1864. Designed by Mr John Dickson. Redesigned and reopened after fire damage in 1964.

Twin towered Gothic façade above street. Sneaked rubble facings, pale stone dressing, slate roof. Four-storey square towers turning octagonal to upper stages, lancet bell-openings, pilasters, set-offs, pinnacles rising through crenellated parapets. Panelled buttresses to lower storeys flanking wide gable with cut-down finial over cusped oculus and large five-light Geometric window, cill-band linked to outer two-light transomed windows. Square-headed Tudor doorways with drip-moulds and carved spandrels to centre, boarded doors with strapwork hinges.

Six-bay flank elevations in similar style with crenellated parapets. Lower three-bay church hall to rear. Boundary walls with panelled pinnacles to piers, elevated forecourt with steps up.
