Active Travel (Wales) Act 2013 Reporting Duties

In accordance with the duties under section 3 (7) of the Active Travel (Wales) Act 2013, please find below the City & County of Swansea's report on the level of use of active travel routes.

The data available will vary between authorities; therefore the template gives examples for the type of data that can be used.

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| Number of existing Active Travel Routes | The Council's Highways Asset Management Plan sets out the totals as: On-road cycle routes – 7.7km Shared Use Path adjacent to carriageway – 4.9km Shared Use Path away from carriageway – 42.3km Total: 54.9km |
| Baseline data at 2016 | The Council had 19 functioning fixed cycle counters in 2016. Data from the five most prominent counters is included below. The figure provided shows the annual average daily number of cyclists passing the counter: Blackpill Lido – 431 Fabian Way – 317 Pont y Cob Road – 281 Trafalgar Bridge – 173 Oystermouth Road – 331 |
| What data was available in your local authority to record usage? | The Council owns and maintains 20 fixed cycle counters at locations across the cycle network. Manual counts are undertaken to aid scheme development, but these are rarely repeated, so cannot be used for comparison. |
| New data at 2017 | Data from the five most prominent counters is included below. The figure provided shows the annual average daily number of cyclists passing the counter: Blackpill Lido – 718 Fabian Way – 307 Pont y Cob Road – 211 Trafalgar Bridge – 120 Oystermouth Road – 346 |
| What data will be available to support the next | A number of the fixed counters have begun to malfunction in the past 12 months, these will be refurbished prior to the next report. |
