Location:-

At the south east entrance to Penrice Castle park, reached by a private lane from the road crossing Oxwich Marsh.

History:-

Penrice Castle was built in 1773-7, with William Gubbings as mason. In 1790 and 1793 Gubbings was paid for gatepiers: probably the gates, railings and piers of all four entrances to the park were added in the early 1790s.

Exterior:-

A formal gateway to Penrice Castle park. The gateway consists of two sandstone piers carrying the gates. The piers are square, about 3.5m apart, heavily rusticated and vermiculated. Tall plinth with base moulding. Small cornice. The finials are stone elongated globes on thin hollow stems, each with a thin vermiculated mid-height band. The globes and cornices have been restores. The gates are plain, in wrought iron, with dog railings.
